Synopsis

The presentation will deal with the requirement to replace ageing ships, the area of operations for these new Irish Naval Service vessels and the design considerations involved in designing for the expected lifespan of 25 years.

Cdr Malone will outline the procedure undertaken to ensure world class vessels could be designed and built within a designated time frame and on cost and to Classification Society requirements.

About the Speaker:

Cdr Malone joined the Irish Naval Service in 1981. He graduated from Cork Regional Technical College in Marine and Plant Engineering in May 1985. He holds an MA in Leadership, Management and Defence Studies from NUI, Maynooth and is a graduate of the Defence Forces Senior Command and Staff course.

Michael is presently responsible for Engineering Planning, Inspection and Maintenance Management in the Naval Service and is programme manager for the new P60 class offshore patrol vessels.

Michael is a Fellow of the Institute of Marine Engineering Science and Technology (FIMarEST), Member of the Institution of Fire Engineers (MI Fire E) and a Member of the Institution of Engineers of Ireland. Michael is a Certified Energy Manager.
